6. RESEARCH INTERESTS

My research interests focus on behavioral and mental health among sexual minorities, family caregivers, and individuals with chronic conditions like HIV/AIDS and dementia. Key areas include psychosocial factors (e.g., suicidal ideation, resilience, post-traumatic growth, stigma, peer norms, self-efficacy, social ecology/networks) via syndemic approaches; innovative health promotion through social marketing, crowdsourcing, designathons, and digital/community engagement; sexual/reproductive health emphasizing HIV prevention, intervention, care, identities, tongzhi subculture, risk behaviors, and disclosure; and caregiving dynamics for dementia/multimorbid elderly, incorporating socio-technical perspectives (e.g., assistive technologies, social media), disclosure processes, preventive care in settings like District Health Centres, self-motivation for health behaviors, and medico-social integration in primary care to advance equity, empowerment, and prevention-focused models.

8. RESEARCH CONTRIBUTIONS

My research contributions center on enhancing health and well-being for vulnerable populations, including sexual minorities and family caregivers of individuals with dementia. Employing diverse methodologies—from randomized controlled trials and longitudinal modeling to crowdsourcing and socio-technical analyses—I advance insights in sexual health, mental health, and caregiving, emphasizing equity and prevention.

In sexual minority health, my award-winning studies have elucidated causal pathways linking peer norms, self-efficacy, and condom use among Chinese men who have sex with men (MSM), revealing heterogeneous behavioral trajectories and informing interventions. Additionally, I documented low HIV non-occupational post-exposure prophylaxis (nPEP) awareness in China, highlighting inequities and guiding targeted education and policy efforts.

In dementia caregiving, I pioneered the "successful caregiving" paradigm, drawing on holistic models to foster resilience and well-being. I am also developing a socio-technical model for IT-enabled support, validating a Dementia Disclosure Evaluation Tool to assess disclosure processes, and synthesizing evidence on medico-social care integration for the Lancet Commission on Primary Health Care, advocating for coordinated systems to address disparities.

I secured funding to explore self-motivation among Hong Kong family carers and earned a strong GRF score (3.5) for a pioneering Hong Kong/China cluster RCT using crowdsourced designathons—rooted in "wisdom of crowds" theory—to manage dementia agitation, aiming to boost caregiver self-efficacy versus traditional methods. Moreover, my HMRF grant application, "Enhancing Older Adults' Awareness and Utilization of Primary Healthcare Services in Hong Kong through Crowdsourced Interventions," has been recommended for support, pending clarifications and amendments, to promote community-driven uptake of primary care.
